





LEADING KIDS IN A GOSPEL CONVERSATION

Gospel is a noun that means "Good News". It is the story of God's plan for our lives. We want to make sure we stay grounded in God's Word, the Bible, and use it to equip the saints; especially kids discussing their faith. 2 Timothy 3:16 & 17 says, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for instruction, for conviction, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, fully equipped for every good work." We want to partner with you and give you this guide to equip you for discussions with your children about salvation. Let them draw the corresponding image and discuss its purpose.



GOD RULES.

Ask: "Who is in charge in your home?" Explain that because God created everything, He is in charge of everything. Read Revelation 4:11.



WE SINNED.

Ask: "Have you ever done something wrong?"
Tell kids that everyone sins, or disobeys God. Our sin separates us from God.
Read Romans 3:23.



GOD PROVIDED.

Explain that God is holy and must punish sin. God sent His Son, Jesus, to take the punishment we deserve. Read John 3:16.



JESUS GIVES.

Ask: "What is the best gift you've ever received?"

Jesus took our punishment for sin by giving His life, and He gives us His righteousness.

God sees us as if we lived the perfect life Jesus lived.

Read 2 Corinthians 5:21.



WE RESPOND.

Explain that everyone has a choice to make.

Ask: "Will you trust Jesus as your Savior and Lord? You can turn from self and sin and turn to Jesus."

Read Romans 10:9-10.
